Litchee Farm, the 5-acre fruit-tree orchard, with gates at 16655 SW 203 Avenue and 16600 SW 202 Avenue in the Redland area of Miami has been occupied for more than two years by Gregory Duque, a 53-year-old unemployed felon convicted of strong-arm robbery, serving time in jail for his misdeeds, booted out of the US Army with a General Discharge after a short stint of active service following a fight with a soldier comrade, having been evicted from two farms for unsavory conduct, and standing accused of grand theft by those who helped him.



We want our neighbors to know that we have done everything in our power via the courts to evict this person from our property and now he is living on County land outside our gate. Unless we all press the County on a regular basis he will probably remain and continue stealing from us.

The owners of Litchee Farm allowed Duque in 2012 to stay when it became quickly abundantly clear he would not earn his keep — stay on the farm in exchange for light labor. He demonstrated his gratitude by stealing the fruit from our trees, selling it, and supplementing his \$700-plus disability payments he has been pocketing. To add insult to injury, he is telling everyone who listens he has undergone a \$120,000 operation in September, a story designed to attract your pity, but hide the fact his strength lets him engage in nefarious acts of labor and strike a blow drawing blood at those who challenge his parasitic lifestyle.

The latest eviction lawsuit forced him to leave the property, but he did not go very far. He is now squatting with his nine dogs and belongings on the county's land outside the farm's fence where he is trying to raise cash by selling property, including items stolen from us. Will he steal from you?
